

We work beside our Kolewateam with local free-lance scouts, give education, advice, organise consultations and make medical treatments possible. Why? Because it is impossible for these families to travel far or to pay for transportation and treatment.

Direct result: We can adapt quickly. We are small of size and close to each other. No long trails and lots of counselling, but we start immediately: we realise the result on short term and in a practical way. We are creative in finding solutions and keep trying until we succeed.

Kolewa wants to set an example to the Indonesian community by informing, motivating, stimulating and supporting and putting forward ideas. With this, a few universal values and rights are leading, such as the rights of the child, right for health and medical treatment. An important focus is their education: not only from the children but also through giving education and information to the parents about (living with) an impairment, personal care and awareness for the environment. Cleft lip & palate surgeries:

Children with cleft lip or an open palate have problems on different levels: eating does not go well, which causes them to be underweight. Frequently they have dental problems which make it harder to speak. A (relatively) easy surgery can give these children the chance to have a healthy and independent life!

We scout potential child patients as well as young-adults and transport them (and their guiding family member) to Bali for surgery and further treatment. Although we were focused on Bali and the Nusa Tenggara islands, also patients from other parts from Indonesia found their way to our Yayasan and asked for help. During treatment, the children and their guardian stay temporary in our shelter Rumah Bicara. The medical staff of the Dharma Yadnya Hospital, driven by plastic surgeon dr. Asmarajaya, focuses on the surgery and hospitalisation. Most children did have a personal sponsor. From July 2018 till the end of the year the procedures for pre-surgery dental care and hospitalisation are financially supported by the Rotary Club Bali Nusa Dua and Yayasan Kolewa was taking care of the costs for transport and shelter.

Our ability to continue providing guidance, care and surgery, free of charge, was dependent on the strong support hat we received from donors from Holland and Indonesia. In 2018 they made it possible to offer 108 patients a life-changing medical journey that left our shelter-home with a new smile.

Rumah Bicara. Rumah Bicara is the home base of Yayasan Kolewa, a building with multiple functions. One of the most important things is that we can give shelter to 12 patients guided each by one family member. Also, two of our staff members live permanent in Rumah Bicara. It is also the place where we gather as a team for meetings and welcome many foreign and local visitors to tell them about our charity program and daily activities.

During the week we offer all our temporary inhabitants three meals a day, an activity program, home-schooling and for children with CLP or a hearing problem speech, therapy and sign language lessons.

The team, assisted by interns and volunteers, make sure our patients and parents enjoy their stay with Yayasan Kolewa and try to offer them many opportunities to encourage them and get a new fresh look at their lives.





Overview CLP children that had surgery in 2018 and stayed in Rumah Bicare, the Kolewa Foundation shelter home in Denpasar.



It is also noticeable in the graph that the cleft lip is found on the left side more often than the right side with both genders.








Special cases

In some exceptional cases we deviate somewhat from the focus of Yayasan Kolewa Harapan Indonesia. An example is mr. Yeskial from Timor with a severe benign tumor. Him and his wife stayed for 8 months with our foundation, faced several times surgery, but went home to family and their child with a remarkable result.

Raya Melani Kale, a seven year old girl, had a bad start after birth. Her umbilical fracture went into unusual proportions. She was afraid to go to school, felt uncomfortable and ashamed, until our scouts came to visit her family and offered help. Right now she turned into a happy lively girl with hopes and dreams about the future. Years of suffering were solved in ten weeks! Sometimes it is just that simple with a little bit help from outside!

Both patients were treated in Sanglah Hospital Denpasar. We used BPJS insurance, expenses that were not covered by the insurance were payed some dear sponsors from Indonesia.

These are just a few examples we mention in our annual review, there were more similar cases in 2018 end there will be in 2019 for sure.



















Our geographic coverage assisted by local scouts and ambassadors of Yayasan Kolewa Harapan Indonesia


Our service area in 2018 counted over 10 Indonesian islands. On each island, we can rely on our free-lance local scouts and parents from former patients to assist us. Indispensable for the communication with families who don't speak Bahasa Indonesia and very helpful to gain the trust of the local community and governmental offices to arrange the needed paperwork for travelling and surgery. We are very grateful to count Silas (Sumba, Tambolaka), Anggie (Sumba, Waingapu), Frans (Rote), Erwin and Nicksone (Kupang, Timor), En (Alor), Romy Hidayat (Lombok) as great assistants in our charity-program. To work with field partners as Yayasan We save Dompu, Harapan Sumbawa Project, and DFC (Doctor Children's Fund) Sumbawa Barat is priceless.

Most of our patients are living in remote areas. Finding them is a challenge, bringing to Bali another one. All team members use motorbike, boat, bus, rental car and aeroplane to reach the villages and guide them to Bali. Sometimes even a journey of three days.

Besides individual visitors we also welcomed groups like the Pikulan Foundation and Imas Training from Holland. A delegation from the Balinese Nitti Mandala Club, Bali Mandara Hospital, Rotary Club Bali Nusa Dua and the Dinas Sosial Kota Denpasar.



From level zero to real communication

In the Renon area of Denpasar, not far from Rumah Bicara (the Kolewa location), Lumina Hearing Centre is located. With sufficient facilities for testing young children in the form of two soundproofed cabins, this is a convenient address for our patients with a hearing problem. During our outreach activities in Bali, we regularly detect children with a hearing problem. In those cases, we offer help and free hearing test in Denpasar. In 2018 we gave 35 children different types of tests, hearing aids and accessories (used and new devices). Transportation and guidance by our team are taken care of naturally. All expenses on account of Yayasan Kolewa Harapan Indonesia.

Most children and parents that knock on our door are in need of special education. The kids do live an isolated life and don't go to school. If parents do use the possibility of free testing and devices we offer, they agree to let their child take part in our speech therapy and sign language every weekend. Parents also endorse the intention to acquire knowledge themselves and to practice sign language to be able to communicate better with their deaf child.







Speech therapy & sign language by Kolewa team in 2018:

Denpasar: every Saturday and Sunday in Rumah Bicara (12 children), the number had increased last months. During the weekend families with children with a hearing problem can visit the shelter home of Yayasan Kolewa Harapan Indonesia in the afternoon to get free training sign language and speech therapy by our staff.

Karangasem: every Sunday (20 - 25 children and parents) Every Sunday from 10 - 12 am two team-member of Yayasan Kolewa Harapan Indonesia give training. Every two weeks a team of Lumina Hearing Centre join to check hearing aid of the children and teachers of Yayasan Corti lead the practice. New children have an intake and simple first hearing test. Both field partners get paid for their services. We use the location of midwife Nusrani Putu and reimbursed the costs of water, coffee, tea and some snacks for the group.

Buleleng: every 20th of the month (20 - 25 children and parents). In Buleleng we were hosted by field partner Stepping Stones. Unfortunately, the commitment in this area was less than we expected. End November the board of Yayasan Kolewa decided to end this part of the program and advised parents to contact the SLB school Singaraja.

School project 2018

From the beginning of 2018, eleven children went to the Yayasan Corti school In Denpasar. Ten of them live in Karangasem, the others in the neighbourhood of our Yayasan. The children were initially oriented by the Kolewa Foundation team to be sufficiently prepared to start the special education.

In July 2018, another three students started at this school. Thanks to Kolewa Foundation's Facebook page fundraising, we were able to give four families the good news that their child could join our program. Just in time for the new semester, we were able to complete and pay the registration and measure for the school uniforms. The children joined their classes for the first time at the end of July.

In addition to the support of two Dutch funds, there are also individuals who sponsor a child's school fees. Jesica and Agus are an example of this. School fees were transferred from the Indonesian Mandiri Bank account to Yayasan Corti.

The monthly contribution to this field partner is also done online.

In total 15 children enjoyed special education daily. Besides the usual education topics, there is a focus on signlanguage and speech-therapy. Special activities like computer-class, dance-class, cooking and swimming are helpful to develop skills and self-confidence.

In December 2018 we were able to order a larger schoolbus thanks donations from Dutch and Indonesian companies. The new bus enables us to enlarge the school project, more capacity for the daily travelling from Karangasem to Denpasar and back home!













Family gatherings

The first family gathering took place in April in Lovina, Singaraja. Children from all over Bali with a hearing problem came to join, together with their parents. During this two-days event, we invited the parents to attend seminars about education, behaviour problems, healthy food and care for their environment.

For the children we checked their hearing-aid, THT-doctors cleaned their ears and our team gave sign language and speech therapy lessons. Also, brush class and lessons about personal hygiene were given.

The second family gathering was in November in Kupang (Timor) focussing on our former patients with cleft lip, open palate and bone graft surgery. Besides a similar program as in Bali, we checked the children if any further treatment was a need. Some of the children that needed surgery, again travelled afterwards with the team to Bali.

During both events the program contained activities for team building, such as creativity, lampion march, sports and fun games. Learning and playing that is our motto. In the end, all got a certificate of attendance.













A great relief for victims of a burn accident, plastic surgery in May!

In May, one of our essential and most heavy program components took place. Thanks to a collaboration with field partner John Fawcett Foundation 12 of our patients had plastic surgery by dr. Anom and his international team in the Puri Raharja Hospital in Denpasar. The patients were from Rote, Komodo, Sumba, Timor and Bali. On an earlier stage, they had all been visited by our team to make sure the right paperwork was done. The parents agreed to come to Bali guided and hosted by Yayasan Kolewa Harapan Indonesia. They all arrived in May with one family member in Denpasar.

Because of the need of airconditioned room after surgery, we rented three rooms outside, others were hosted in Rumah Bicara. During the first weeks, after the patients were dismissed from the hospital, they went back on a regular base for wound care. Later on, this was done by Kolewa team member Uttari and volunteer Charles (nurse). End of June still 7 patients stayed with us for wound care and physiotherapy sessions for a few months. The results were very satisfying. Only a few of them need surgery again in 2019. Others can finally live a normal life by using arm or leg in a healthy way after years of being disabled. Interns "social workers" were a valuable addition to the team with so many people to guide.



Together with each other, energetic and full of trust for the surgery to come. All three kids had an awful accident in the past and never got help. Their scars and keloid made normal life impossible. They faced pain, disappointments and shame. The solutions offered by Yayasan Kolewa Harapan Indonesia for Heldi, Daud and Jeni ,were a gift they could only dream of for many years.











Outreach activities:

Regular our team went upcountry to visit families in remote areas. The primary goal is to distribute the Tulip water filter system. In 2018 we gave over 250 houses and their inhabitants the possibility to filter water from their well, stored rainwater or water from the river, into trustable drink water.

A side effect from these home visits is that we can monitor health problems. We donated several walkers, wheelchairs and medication there where needed. Medical intern dr. Henk Schoemaker joined our activities for 2 months. Travelling through Bali, Timor and Sumba he advised our staff and reassured people to go and see a local doctor or that there were no health issues that needed treatment at all.

Another part of our outreach is our collaboration with Yayasan Sedasa Sunar. We joined three times their "Baksos". Using the classrooms of a public school in the poor areas of



Karangasem and Buleleng, the population of six surrounding villages were invited for a medical check-up. The Kolewa team makes sure that all schoolchildren don't get bored while waiting. We gave seminars about healthy life, arranged creativity activities and support the organising party with a donation of 5.000.000 Indonesian Roepiah.

Our counterpart in Holland collected used glasses, hearing-aid and other medical aid, which we donated to the local Puskesmas.



On demand of the local government we occasionally joined twice an event, organised by the Dinas Sosial. Once to support elderly priests with a goody-bag that contained food items. The other time board members Putu and Uttari distributed medication to those who got a prescription from the participating doctors but had no money to buy the things themselves.





Supporting victim of natural disasters:



The island of Lombok faced a terrible disaster in August 2018. Our local scout in the area of Mataram updated us frequently about the situation. After sending some donations for stationary for school-kids, our team visited Lombok in December 2018 to learn more about the current activities regarding rebuilding schools and houses. Confronted with many problems, we decided to accept one project for 2019: rebuilding a "kindergarten" thanks to sponsor Stichting Pikulan from Holland.







During the first semester of 2018, the team of Yayasan Kolewa Harapan Indonesia weekly offered support to the evacuees of the Mount Agung. Due to eruption dangers of this volcano, many families stayed in shelters with lack of food, personal care items, water and plastic covers to protect them in the rain season. In the case of health problems, we arranged treatment and medication. Besides we distributed water filters and gave budget to build sanitary solutions.















Joined hands:

Working together, sharing knowledge and experiences is indispensable. In 2018 we joined on a regular base with field partners in Bali to get the most successful results during the healing journey of a child or young adult.

The John Fawcett Foundation was our partner during the plastic surgery marathon for burn patients. But also frequently we guided people with eye problems to their consultation hours in Sanur on Wednesday.

In Anika Linden Centre we have a good relationship with foundations as Yayasan Puspadi Bali and Yayasan Peduli Kemanusian (YPK)

They provided our clubfoot children with special shoes and braces. Our burn patients, children with hydrocephalus and burns, got physiotherapy after surgery for free.

In return, we donated used walkers, wheelchairs and sticks to them.

In Buleleng partner Steppingstones Bali offered us their accommodation to enable us to give speech therapy and sign language lessons to deaf and badhearing children in that neighbourhood once a month.


